
Here are the 1 octave scales of C, G and D Major, in 3rd position.

These scales use the finger pattern you see on the right (Finger Pattern 3).


Watch out for the 'semitone' (half step) between the 3rd and 4th fingers!

Move your hand to 3rd possen of ron Geard D finger:


