Minims and Semibreves

Half Notes and Whole Notes





The **minim** lasts for two beats. In America it is called a **half note**. The rhythm name for the minim is 'slow-ow'. On the second syllable ('ow'), make a silent 'chop' movement with your hands, to mark the 2nd beat.

Semibreve slow-ow-ow-ow

The **semibreve** lasts for 4 beats. In America, it is called a **whole note**. The rhythm name for the semibreve is 'slow-ow-ow-ow'. Make a silent 'chop' movement on each 'ow' syllable, to mark the 2nd, 3rd and 4th beats.



The **minim rest** lasts for 2 whole beats. Remember this rhyme: The <u>M</u>inim <u>M</u>eets the <u>M</u>iddle Line!

Semibreve Rest

The **semibreve** rest lasts for 4 whole beats. Remember this rhyme: The <u>Semibreve</u> <u>Swings from the <u>Second line down!</u></u>

The semibreve rest is also used to show a whole bar rest.

Activities

Play through the **Echo Song**, first on your own, then with a partner. They should copy each note after you play it, using the same bow speed and dynamics as you, just like an echo. Make a big circle in the air with your bow during your rests!
